## OBIMION

In this proceeding, Helene W. Files, H. T. Wadloy and Pearle W. Herding, doing business as co-partners under the fictitious firm name of Manchester Heights Water Company, ask the Railroad Commission for authority to abandon public utility water service within the city limits of Los Angeles.

A public hearing in this metter was held at Los Angeles.

This water company has been operating in the Manchester

Meights district for many years and just recently was authorized

by this Commission in its Docision No. 33761, dated December 21,

1940, to sell and transfer to Southern California Water Company,

a corporation, its principal water properties serving some 800

consumers all living outside of the city limits of Los Angeles.

There remained, however, a portion of the water system supplying

some 47 consumers in the Dolan Tract (No. 8440, Los Angeles County) which was not acquired by said Southern Celifornia Water Company because this tract is located within the Los Angeles city limits and has heretofore been piped throughout with water mains by the City's Department of Water and Power.

Mr. C. A. Poling, water sales agent for the said
Department, testified that as long ago as July, 1930, the City had
installed 6-inch cast iron water mains with service connections to
each of the 255 lots in the Dolen Tract and was now serving water
to all residents of this subdivision with the exception of the
few still supplied by applicants herein. This witness further
testified that the Department of Water and Power was ready and
willing to install the necessary pipe connections immediately and
without cost to all applicants' consumers in this tract upon
demand, provided this Commission authorizes discontinuance of
service as requested herein.

The evidence conclusively shows that the entire water plant operated by this company in the Dolan Tract is seriously in need of immediate and complete rehabilitation, requiring so large an expenditure of funds as to render future operation with the permanently restricted number of consumers impossible except at a continued out-of-pocket loss. In view of the fact that no protests were made by any of the Company's consumers, and that the Bureau of Water Works and Supply of the City of Los Angeles through its Department of Water and Power is now and for a considerable number of years last past has been furnished water throughout the entire Dolan Tract, it is clearly to the best interests of the public at this time that the application be granted.

For all other purposes the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.

The foregoing Opinion and Order are hereby approved and ordered filed as the Opinion and Order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.
