BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

The City of Burbank is authorized to construct Buena Vista Street at grade across Coast Line of Southern Pacific Company at Burbank, Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E-461.5. Construction, maintenance, and protection expense shall be borne in accordance with the terms of an agreement to be entered into between applicant and Southern Pacific Company, a certified copy of which shall be filed with this Commission within ninety (90) days from the effective date hereof. Should said agreement not be filed within the above time and further time be not granted by subsequent order, said costs will be apportioned by supplemental order herein.

Width of crossing shall be not less than fifty-six feet and grades of approach not greater than five per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by the two Standard No. 5 flashing light signals (G. O. No. 75-B) now in place at the Lincoln Street crossing which shall be removed and reinstalled at the Buena Vista Street crossing. During the period in which the crossing signals are being transferred from Lincoln Street to Buena Vista, both crossings shall be provided with twenty-four hour human flagmen. The cost of providing this temporary protection shall be borne by applicant.

Upon completion of the crossing herein authorized and upon its being opened to public use and travel, Crossing No. E-461.6, about 700 feet east, shall be abandoned and effectively closed to public use and travel.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
