O P I N I O N

The above numbered formal complaint was filed by the City of Compton on December 29, 1938, and asks that this Commission issue its Order requiring Pacific Electric Railway Company to erect a new, modern and adequate passenger station in the City of Compton.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Ager at Compton on March 16 and 17, 1939, and the matter was submitted upon the filing of briefs.

Subsequent to the date of submission, a series of informal conferences between representatives of the City of Compton and Pacific Electric Railway Company were held, as a result of which Pacific Electric Railway Company agreed to prepare and submit to the City of Compton, for its approval, plans for the modernization of its station facilities. Such plans were prepared and approved

and the station has been rebuilt and opened to public use as of August 30, 1940.






Under date of January 15, 1941, complainant directed a letter to the Commission requesting that the matter be dismissed.
