SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 32842 of February 27, 1940, Fred N. Worth, who acquired C.A. Worth & Co. through the distribution of the estate of Minnie I. Worth, deceased, was authorized to transport drugs, drug sundries and liquors for Coffin-Redington Co., from San Francisco to Oakland, Alameda, San Leandro, Emeryville, Berkeley and Richmond, at rates less than established minimum rates. This authority will expire February 28, 1941. By supplemental application, extension of the authority for at least one year is sought. It is alleged that, since the authority was granted, the only material change in operating conditions is an increase in applicant's expenses occasioned by the payment of vacation wages to drivers. Applicant states that the sum of \$4 per truck per month covers this additional expense, that Coffin-Redington Co. reimbursed him for the vacation wages paid drivers during 1940, and that it is willing to continue to bear this expense.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, and that extension of the authority is justified. The authority will be modified, however, so as to reflect the increased operating expense experienced by applicant, and will be limited to a one-year period unless sooner cancelled, changed or extended by appropriate order. Applicant will be expected to notify the Commission promptly should cancellation, change or further extension of the authority become necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the words and figures in the first ordering paragraph of Decision No. 32842 of February 27, 1940, in this proceeding, reading "\$290 per calendar month per truck" be and they are hereby amended to read "\$294 per calendar month per truck," and that the authority granted Fred N. Worth in and by said Decision No. 32842 of February 27, 1940, as so amended, be and it is hereby extended to February 28, 1942, unless sooner changed, cancelled or extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective February 28, 1941.
