SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 32010 of May 16, 1939, as amended, in the above entitled application, Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company, a city carrier, was authorized to transport property for Butler Brothers within the City and County of San Francisco at a rate less than the established minimum rates. This authority will expire June 5, 1941. By supplemental application, as amended, indefinite extension of the authority is sought. It is represented that although operating costs are now somewhat higher than those which prevailed at the time the authority was granted the rate involved is still compensatory because the higher costs have been offset by reductions attributable to the increased efficiency of the interested shipper's receiving and shipping departments and to the improved loading and unloading facilities it now maintains.

It appears that this is a matter in which public hearing is not necessary and that an extension of the authority is justified. Due, however, to the possibility that the conditions under which this service is rendered may change at any time, the extension will be limited to a one-year period.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company by Decision No. 32010 of May 16, 1939, as amended, in the above entitled application, be and it is hereby extended to June 5, 1942, unless sooner changed, canceled or extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective June 5, 1941.
