OPINION AND ORDER

By this application Antone A. Anastasi, doing business as the Oakland Bean Cleaning and Storage Company, seeks authority from the Commission to transfer warehouse operations heretofore conducted under a certificate of public convenience and necessity at Terminal Building "C", Port of Oakland, to Terminal Building "D",¹ Terminal and Pier Streets, Oakland.

According to the application the United States Government has taken over Terminal Building "C" for military purposes, thereby requiring the applicant to vacate. It is asserted that the space to be occupied at Terminal Building "D" will not exceed 25,000 square feet; that the commodities to be cleaned and stored are the same as in the past; and that the rates to be charged are those currently published in Oakland Bean Cleaning and Storage Company Warehouse Tariff No. 1, C.R.C. No. 1, which became effective September 15, 1937.

The California Warehousemen's Association has advised

By Decision No. 30051 of August 16, 1937, in Application No. 21127, the Commission granted Antone A. Anastasi a certificate of public convenience and necessity to conduct warehouse operations at Terminal Building "C", Port of Oakland, within a defined space of 25,000 square feet, for the purpose of cleaning and storing such commodities as beans, peanuts, rice and peas.

the Commission in writing that it has no objection to the granting
of the application.² Written endorsements favoring its granting
have been submitted by the Port of Oakland and the Oakland Chamber
of Commerce.

This appears to be a matter concerning which a public
hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Antone A. Anastasi, doing
business as Oakland Bean Cleaning and Storage Company, be and he
is hereby authorized to transfer warehousing operations heretofore
conducted under a certificate of public convenience and necessity
at Terminal Building "C", Port of Oakland, to Terminal Building "D",
Terminal and Pier Streets, Oakland, subject to the following con-
ditions:

1. Applicant's operations shall be confined to the stor-
age only of beans and peas, uncleaned, intended to be
cleaned by applicant, or cleaned beans intended to be
re-cleaned or reconditioned to meet specific grades, or
for consolidating with beans or peas cleaned or re-
cleaned by applicant, and the storage of foreign pea-
nuts and rice which are received by applicant, the
owner of which gives written intention or order for
cleaning or reconditioning of said products which have
been cleaned or reconditioned at applicant's cleaner.
2. Applicant's operations shall be conducted at the
specific site and location and no other, viz.,
Terminal Building "D", Terminal and Pier Streets,
Oakland.
3. The warehouse space for which this certificate is
issued shall be limited now and hereafter to not
more than 25,000 square feet.




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At the hearing in Application No. 21127 the California Warehouse-
men's Association requested that the certificate granted therein be
confined to Terminal Building "C", Oakland.

4. Applicant shall file in duplicate within a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date hereof, effective on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, amendment to its Warehouse Tariff No. 1, C.R.C. No. 1, naming the new situs of operations.
5. The rights and privileges herein authorized may not be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been obtained.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
