Applicant shall commence the service herein authorized within a period of not to exceed ninety (90) days from the effective date hereof, and shall file, in triplicate, and concurrently make effective on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Railroad Commission and the public, a tariff or tariffs constructed in accordance with the requirements of the Commission's General Orders and containing rates and rules which in volume and effect shall conform to the certificate herein granted, and be satisfactory to the Commission.
- "2. Applicant shall file, in triplicate, and make effective within a period of not to exceed ninety (90) days after the effective date of this order, on not less than five (5) days notice to the Railroad Commission and the public, a time schedule or time schedules covering the service herein authorized in a form satisfactory to the Railroad Commission."
