In the Matter of the Application of SACRAMENTO-CORNING FREIGHT LINES, LTD., a corporation, for certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a common carrier auto truck freight service for the transportation of property between Sacramento and Keswick Dam, California, and intermediate points, as an extension of existing operative rights, and as a further extension of existing operative rights to extend its pickup and delivery limits at Sacramento, California, to include the contiguous territory of North Sacramento.

BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION

Sacramento-Corning Freight Lines, Ltd., a corporation, herein requests authority to establish and operate an on-call highway common carrier service between Redding and Keswick Dam, now under construction as a part of the Central Valley Water Project, at a point approximately six miles northwest of Redding on the Sacramento River. Additionally, applicant requests authority to serve all intermediate points between termini and laterally within three miles on either side of the so-called Keswick Dam Road which will be the route traversed.

Applicant alleges that at the present time there is no highway common carrier service operated between Redding and the dam site which, it is said, will be located on the east side of

the Sacramento River. Furthermore, it is alleged that the construction and maintenance of the Keswick Dam now requires, and in the future will require, transportation facilities such as proposed by the applicant.

In addition to the extension of operative rights above referred to, applicant seeks to establish pickup and delivery limits specifically including North Sacramento and a definitely described area in and adjacent to North Sacramento, for the purpose of more adequately serving the numerous industries and other shippers now allegedly located therein.

Applicant's requests for authority to extend its highway common carrier service to Keswick Dam and for extension of its pickup and delivery limits at Sacramento, appear reasonable, in the public interest, and matters not requiring a public hearing.

The application, therefore, will be granted.

ORDER

The Commission having fully considered the aboveentitled matter and having found as a fact that public convenience and necessity so require:

⁽¹⁾ Southern Pacific Company operates at the present time into Keswick, located on the west side of the Sacramento River, and no bridge or other facilities exist for crossing the river at Keswick.

⁽²⁾ The Commission, by Decision No. 34540, dated August 26, 1941, in Case No. 4246, amended Item 260-5-A, page 30-A of Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 to include the area referred to above within the pickup and delivery limits of Sacramento.

3. Comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing tariffs and time schedules in compliance therewith, in triplicate, within sixty (60) days from the effective date of this order and upon not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public.

Sacramento-Corning Freight Lines, Ltd., its successors or assigns, may never claim before this Commission, or any court or other public body, a value for the authority hereby granted in excess of the actual cost thereof.

The effective date of this order shall be ten (10) days from the date hereof.
