ORDER

ORIGINAL

Pacific Electric Railway Company has requested authority to discontinue service on its New Delhi-Dyer Line in Orange County and to remove that portion of this line which is owned by applicant. Operations over this line have in the past been for the purpose of serving the Holly Sugar Company at Dyer and such operations are for the most part carried on over tracks of Southern Pacific Company. The industry is now being served exclusively by Southern Pacific Company and has requested applicant to remove the trolley wires from its yard at Dyer.

Good Cause Appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pacific Electric Railway Company is hereby authorized to discontinue service on its New Delhi-Dyer Line; to abandon and remove that portion of this line owned by the Pacific Electric Railway Company at New Delhi as described in the application; and to cancel all tariffs and schedules applying to such line on one day's notice to the Commission and to the public.

Within thirty days after abandonment and removal of the service and facilities authorized herein applicant shall so notify the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended.

This order shall be effective immediately.
