ORDER

The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company and The Western Pacific Railroad Company are authorized to construct interchange tracks at grade across Charter Way, and Union, Clay, Jackson, Jefferson, Anderson, Worth, Taylor, and Pilgrim Streets in Stockton, San Joaquin County, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as follows:


Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Construction of the crossings with Charter Way (surface crossings), and Union, Jackson, Jefferson, Taylor, and Pilgrim Streets shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without super-elevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now

graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding six (6) per cent. Protection shall be by one Standard No. 1 crossing sign (G.O.No.75-B) at Crossings Nos. 4-92.71-C and 4-92.8-C and by one additional sign at Crossings Nos. 4-92.9, 4-92.95, and 2-1120.5.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
