BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 33916, dated February 18, 1941, authorized the transfer of a highway common carrier operative right, limited to the transportation of livestock, from Manuel and Frank Artozqui and Joe Muratore to the first two named parties, conditioned upon the filing of tariffs and time schedules within a specified time.

Allegedly through inadvertence, the parties failed to make the filings within the time allowed and thereby voided the said decision.

By supplemental application the parties now request reinstatement of Decision No. 33916.

Good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS ORDERED that the order contained in Decision No. 33916, dated February 18, 1941, in the above-entitled proceeding and each and all of the terms and provisions thereof and the declarations therein contained, be and they are hereby adopted and made a part hereof by reference to the same extent and with

the same force and effect as though the same were here set forth in full; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in lieu of the conditions contained in the order of said Decision No. 33916, applicants herein shall comply with the Commission's General Order No. 80 and with Part IV of the Commission's General Order No. 93-A by filing, in triplicate, tariffs and time schedules required by such rules within ninety (90) days from the effective date of this order and on at least five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
