trict), for an order authorizing construction of
a crossing at separated grades of a Naval Access
Road and the tracks of the Southern Pacific Rail-
road and the Western Pacific Railroad, at Adeline
Street, in the City of Oakland, Alameda County,
California.

O R D E R

ORIGINAL

The People of the State of California, on relation of the
Department of Public Works, acting on behalf of the United States
Twelfth Naval District, are authorized to construct a Naval Access
Road at separated grades over the tracks of Southern Pacific Company
and The Western Pacific Railroad Company in Oakland, Alameda County,
at the location as shown by map (Exhibit A) attached to the applica-
tion, to be identified as Crossings Nos. D-5.9-A and 4-6.16-AC res-
pectively. No part of construction or maintenance expense shall be
borne by Southern Pacific Company or The Western Pacific Railroad
Company and said companies shall be reimbursed for any expense in-
curred in connection with the construction of said grade separation.
Applicant shall file with the Commission within one hundred and
twenty days: (1) a copy of an agreement entered into between the
parties relative to the construction and maintenance of said cross-
ing, and (2) plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Com-
pany and The Western Pacific Railroad Company.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order,
applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authoriza-
tion shall become void if not exercised within two years, unless time
be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. This order

shall be effective immediately.
