THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER


By Decision No. 34813 of December 2, 1941, the Commission authorized The River Lines to transport certain petroleum specialty products from Richmond, Oleum, Martinez and Avon, to Rio Vista. Among the specialty products which should have been included in said order but which were inadvertently omitted therefrom are the following two items: Petroleum fatty acid, or naphthenic acid; Wax Tailings. The Commission's attention having been directed to the omission of these commodities from its order, and good cause appearing,



IT IS ORDERED that the first ordering paragraph of Decision No. 34813 of December 2, 1941, in the above entitled proceeding be, and it is hereby amended to include the following commodities: Petroleum fatty acid, or naphthenic acid; and Wax Tailings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in all other respects the order in Decision No. 34813 shall continue in full force and effect.
