ORDER

The Western Pacific Railroad Company is authorized to relocate an existing spur track and to construct two additional spur tracks at grade across Eighth Street in San Francisco, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as portions of crossing No. 4L-0.2. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossings shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 4 of G. O. No. 72, without super-clevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, and with tops of rails flush with readway. Protection shall be by Standard No. 4 crossing signs (G. O. 75-B) now in place.

No train, motor, engine or car shall enter upon said crossing at a speed greater than ten (10) miles per hour and unless traffic on the highway be protected by a member of the train crew or other competent employee acting as a flagman. After having entered upon the crossing, it shall be cleared as quickly as is practicable.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied

with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
