FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 33980 of March 11, 1941, in this proceeding, Stephen W. Bowman, a highway contract carrier, was authorized to transport specified property between Hollister and San Benito and intermediate points at rates less than the established minimum rates. This authority will expire March 31, 1942. By supplemental application, indefinite extension of the authority is sought. It is alleged that since the granting of the authority there has been no substantial change in the conditions surrounding the transportation in question and that during its effectiveness the rates charged thereunder have produced satisfactory revenues.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that an extension of the authority is justified. Due, however, to the possibility that the conditions under which this service is rendered may change at any time, the extension will be limited to a one-year period.

Therefore, good cause appearing,




