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OPINION

James H. Cochrane here seeks a license to engage in (1) the business of a motor carrier transportation agent at 1933 San Pablo Avenue, Oakland.

He proposes to limit his business to the arranging of transportation between so-called casual or share-expense operators of automobiles destined to points outside of the State of California, on the one hand, and persons seeking transportation to such points, on the other hand. Compensation will be exacted from both car operator and passenger.

After public hearing before Examiner McGettigan in San Francisco and Oakland on October 7 and 15, 1941, respectively, the matter was submitted on briefs duly filed with the Commission and it is now ready for decision.

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Granting of the license sought was opposed by Passenger Carriers, Inc.

Applicant has been for the past two and one-half years, and was at the time of the hearing, doing business as a motor carrier transportation agent without a license at the San Pablo Avenue address above mentioned. He has also engaged in such business without a license in San Francisco, Los Angeles, Hollywood and San Jose. Applicant has operated as a passenger (2) stage corporation between San Francisco and Los Angeles without holding a certificate from the Railroad Commission authorizing (3) him to so operate. During the time that applicant has been engaged in these activities, persons employed by him and working under his direction have been arrested for violations of the Motor Carrier Transportation Agent Act.

After a full consideration of all of the facts of record in this matter the Commission is of the opinion and finds that applicant is not a fit and proper person to hold a license as a motor carrier transportation agent and that his application should, therefore, be denied.

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Public hearing having been had in the above-entitled proceeding, evidence having been received, the matter having been submitted, and the Commission now being fully advised in the premises,
