## THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By supplemental application, Fred N. Worth seeks a oneyear extension of the authority granted him by Decision No. 32842, as amended, in this proceeding, to transport drugs, drug sundries and liquors for Coffin-Redington Co. from San Francisco to Oakland, Alameda, San Leandro, Emeryville, Berkeley and Richmond at rates less than the established minimum rates. This authority will expire February 28, 1942.

In support of the sought extension of authority, it is alleged that, although certain operating costs have increased since the use of the rates in question was authorized, these rates still produce sufficient revenues for compensatory operations thereunder and that in other respects conditions surrounding the transportation involved remain unchanged.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the proposed extension of the authority is justified. Therefore, good cause appearing,

Fred N. Worth acquired C. A. Worth & Co. through the distribution of the estate of Minnie I. Worth, deceased.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the authority granted Fred N. Worth in and by Decision No. 32842, as amended, in this proceeding be and it is hereby extended to February 28, 1943, unless sooner changed, canceled or extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective February 28, 1942.
