BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY and SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY, its lessee, for authority to sell to Food Machinery Corporation certain real property in the City of Riverside, California, and in connection therewith to remove certain railroad tracks and facilities thereon and in the immediate vicinity thereof.

ORDER

Southern Pacific Railroad Company and Southern Pacific Company, its lessee, on February 24, 1942, applied for authority to sell certain parcels of operative property in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, to Food Machinery Corporation for the sum of \$15,000.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted subject to certain conditions:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Railroad Company and Southern Pacific Company, its lessee, are hereby authorized to sell all of those certain lots in the City of Riverside, County of Riverside, State of California, being all of lots 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 of Block 8; all of lots 4, 5, 6, and 7 of Block 14; and all of lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 of Block 16, of the Santa Fe Tract in the City of Riverside, according to J. W. Johnson's survey of said tract, and as shown by the Los Angeles Division Drawing D-1104, Sheet No. 1 attached to the application, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Southern Pacific Company shall within thirty (30) days after the transfer of said properties, file with the Commission a copy of the deed by means of which it and Southern Pacific Railroad Company conveyed title to said properties.

- (2) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
