SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By supplemental application, J.D. Chace, a city and highway contract carrier, seeks extension of the authority granted him by Decision No. 32928, as amended, in this proceeding, to transport petroleum fuel oil for Tide Water Associated Oil Company within the City of San Jose and designated contiguous territory at rates less than the established minimum rates. Chace's present authority will expire March 26, 1942. He proposes that it be extended for such further period as the Commission may deem appropriate.

It is alleged that while there have been some increases in operating costs since the granting of the authority in question there has been no substantial change in the general conditions surrounding the transportation involved; that despite the higher costs applicant is now experiencing the rates sought to be continued will return a reasonable profit; and that applicant believes these conditions will continue indefinitely.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that an extension of the authority is justified. Because the conditions under which this service is being rendered may change at any time the extension will be limited to a one-year period. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the authority granted J.D. Chace by Decision No. 32928, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to March 26, 1943, unless sooner changed, cancelled or extended by appropriate order of the Commission.
