O P I N I O N

Walter B. Tindell, by the above-entitled application, requests authority to temporarily suspend his highway common carrier service between Monterey, Sacramento and intermediate points.

Applicant was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity by Decision No. 24452, in Application No. 17527, to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of fish between Sacramento, Monterey and certain points intermediate thereto.

It is alleged in the application that since war was declared on December 8, 1941 there have not been sufficient fish available to constitute a single load. Applicant asserts that no fish are being brought in for transportation by him as about 96 per cent of the fishermen at Monterey are aliens prohibited from taking boats out to engage in fishing.

This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. Applicant's request is reasonable and will be granted.

O R D E R

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Walter B. Tindell is authorized to discontinue the highway common carrier service operated between Monterey, Sacramento and intermediate points pursuant to the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted him by Decision No. 24452, in Application No. 17527, until Friday, April 30, 1943, provided his tariff and time schedule are amended on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public to show that such service has been suspended temporarily as authorized herein.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
