FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 35136 of March 17, 1942, in this proceeding, Western Compress Company was authorized to execute a proposed agreement subleasing public utility warehouse property located at Los Angeles Harbor to the United States of America, and to suspend public utility warehouse operations until July 1, 1943 upon the execution of that agreement. Thereafter, but before execution of the agreement, immediate possession of the property in question was secured by the United States under an order from the District Court. This has resulted in the suspension of warehouse operations under circumstances which have prevented applicant from complying with the conditions of the aforesaid decision. These conditions should be modified accordingly.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Western Compress Company, a corporation, be and it is hereby authorized to suspend public utility warehouse operations at Los Angeles Harbor until July 1, 1943; and that the said Western Compress Company shall forthwith amend its tariffs on file with the Commission to show that operations have been suspended as authorized herein.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
