O P I N I O N

Pacific Motor Trucking Company by the above-entitled application requests a highway common carrier certificate authorizing it to transport property between San Bernardino and the United States Army Air Corps Maintenance and Supply Depot some three miles east of San Bernardino.

It is alleged in the application that the depot is being developed as a national defense project. The application states that barracks, hangars, warehouses, machine shops and runways are being constructed. It is averred that a heavy movement of supplies and materials will have to be transported during construction and that a steady movement of merchandise traffic, parts and supplies will continue after the project is completed.

Applicant proposes to file tariffs in its own name and also to establish joint rates with rail carriers.

It appears from the application and the evidence of record that there is a need for the proposed service. Public hearing in this matter seems unnecessary. After full consideration, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that public convenience and necessity require that this application be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Pacific Motor Trucking Company authorizing it to operate as a highway common carrier as that term is defined in section 2-3/4 of the Public Utilities Act between San Bernardino and the United States Army Air Corps Maintenance and Supply Depot located approximately three miles east of San Bernardino.

Pacific Motor Trucking Company its successors or assigns may never claim before this Commission, or any court or other public body, a value for the authority hereby granted in excess of the actual cost thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the operation of said highway common carrier service, Pacific Motor Trucking Company shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:

1. File a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date hereof.
2. Subject to the authority of this Commission to change or modify them at any time by further order, conduct said highway common carrier operations over and along the most appropriate route or routes between the points herein authorized to be served.
3. Comply with the rules of the Commission's General Order No. 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing, in triplicate, and concurrently making effective, tariffs and time schedules satisfactory to the Commission within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
