IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that ordering paragraph No. 6 of Decision No. 35211 of March 31, 1942, be, and it is hereby, amended by adding to Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2, Tenth Revised Page 15 in lieu of Ninth Revised Page 15, and First Revised Page 49-B in lieu of Original Page 49-B, which revised pages are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hercof.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that ordering paragraph No. 12 of Decision No. 35211 of March 31, 1942, be, and it is

hereby, amended by substituting therein "Decision No. 33494" for "Decision No. 34494," and that the opinion, findings, and order of said Decision No. 35211 shall stand as amended by this and the preceding ordering paragraph.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that in all other respects said petitions be, and they are hereby, denied.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
