OPINION

A. W. Schmitt, doing business as Livermore Valley Stages, is now providing passenger stage service between Livermore and Arroyo Sanitarium, and intermediate points, for the transportation of passengers under an operative right acquired by him under authority of the Commission's Decision No. 18221, on Application No. (1) 13635. In the above-entitled application, Schmitt requests an extension of that right between Livermore and Wagoner Field Naval Air Training Station and intermediate points.

Applicant proposes to publish a one-way fare of 15 cents. An 8-ride commutation ticket, good for thirty days, would be sold for \$1. The distance between Livermore and the Field is approximately three miles. Three round trip daily schedules would be operated during the evening hours from approximately 5:30 p.m. to about 11:30. This service is designed to care for the present needs of the construction personnel now engaged in erecting facilities, including housing accommodations, at the Training Station. It is asserted that upon the completion of these facilities a Naval and Civilian

complement of considerable size will be stationed there. Applicant asserts that he has been requested by the Commanding Officer of the Training Station to establish the proposed service as quickly as possible.

No other passenger stage operator serves between the points involved herein. No public hearing is necessary and we are of the opinion and so find that public convenience and necessity require the establishment and operation of the proposed service. The order will so provide.

ORDER

An application having been filed as above-entitled and it being found that public convenience and necessity so require:

IT IS ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to A. W. Schmitt authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in section 2½ of the Public Utilities Act, for the transportation of passengers and their baggage between Livermore and Wagoner Field Naval Air Training Station, and intermediate points, as an extension and enlargement of the operative right acquired by applicant by Decision No. 18221, as amended by Decision No. 30698, subject to the condition that applicant his successors or assigns may never claim before this Commission or any court or other public body a value for the certificate herein granted in excess of the actual cost thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the operation of the passenger stage service pursuant to the foregoing certificate, the following service regulations shall be observed:
