THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 32010 of May 16, 1939, as amended, in this proceeding, Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company, a city carrier, was authorized to transport property within the City and County of San Francisco for Butler Brothers at a rate less than the established minimum rates. This authority will expire June 5, 1942. By supplemental application indefinite extension of the authority is sought.

In support of the proposed extension it is represented that although somewhat higher costs have been experienced for repair materials, supplies and tires, these increases in operating expenses have not impaired applicant's ability to perform the service involved on a compensatory basis under the rate sought to be continued; and that in other important respects conditions surrounding the transportation in question have not changed since the outstanding authority was granted.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that an extension of the authority is jus-

tified. Due, however, to the possibility that the conditions under which this service is rendered may change at any time, the extension will be limited to a one-year period, unless sooner changed, cancelled or further extended.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted Walkup Drayage and Warehouse Company by Decision No. 32010 of May 16, 1939, as amended, in the above entitled application, be and it is hereby extended to June 5, 1943, unless sooner changed, canceled or further extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective June 5, 1942.
