O P I N I O N

This is an application for a license to engage in
business as a motor carrier transportation agent. Public hearing
was held in Los Angeles before Examiner Cameron on March 27, 1942.

Applicant intends to do business as such agent at
239 East Seventh Street, Los Angeles, California, as an employee
of Sheldon Lee Farber who operates under a motor carrier transpor-
tation agent license heretofore issued by this Commission. His
activities as such agent would be under the entire direction and
control of his employer.

Applicant has been a resident of the city of Los Angeles
for several years. He has been convicted of the commission of a
number of misdemeanors involving the use of intoxicating liquors.
These misdemeanors were committed in Los Angeles and in other
cities. The most recent conviction occurred in January, 1942.

After a full consideration of all the facts of record in this matter, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that applicant is not a fit and proper person to receive a license to operate as a motor carrier transportation agent and his application should therefore, be denied.

O R D E R

Public hearing having been held in the above-entitled proceeding, evidence having been received, the matter having been submitted, and the Commission now being fully advised in the premises:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application of Charles A. Olsen for a license to operate as a motor carrier transportation agent at 239 East Seventh Street, Los Angeles, California, be and the same is hereby denied.

This order shall be effective upon the date hereof.
