OPINION AND ORDER

Buttonwillow Warehouse Co. is a limited partnership formed by the four stockholders of Buttonwillow Warehouse Company, a corporation, operating as a public utility warehouseman at Buttonwillow. By this application approval of the Commission is sought for dissolution of the corporation, transfer of its assets to the stockholders and formation of the partnership. Each of the partners will have the same interest as they had as stockholders in the public utility warehouse business involved and in its assets. No change is to be made in the service to the public nor in the rates maintained therefor.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that to the extent the application involves the transfer of property necessary and useful in the public utility warehouse operation in question, it should be granted. Dissolution of the corporation and formation of the partnership are not matters requiring specific authorization from the Commission.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Buttonwillow Warehouse Co., a limited partnership, be and it is hereby authorized to acquire property necessary and useful in the public utility warehouse business involved in the above entitled application.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that immediately upon the transfer of the aforesaid warehouse property, tariffs on file with the Commission naming rates, rules and regulations covering the warehouse operations involved shall be amended, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, to show that Buttonwillow Warehouse Company, a corporation, has withdrawn from or canceled said rates, rules and regulations and that Buttonwillow Warehouse Co., a limited partnership, has concurrently adopted or established them as its own; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall, in other respects, comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
