BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, Stockton Warehouse Company seeks authority to discontinue public utility warehouse operations at Stockton and to lease to Wilbur-Ellis Company and Haslett Warehouse Company the warehouse property and equipment used in those operations. A copy of the lease which applicants propose to execute is on file in this proceeding as Exhibit "F". Applicants state that the lessees will use the leased property for public utility warehouse operations. No change in the tariff rates nor in the service to the public is proposed.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Stockton Warehouse Company, a corporation, be and it is hereby authorized to lease to Wilbur-Ellis Company, a corporation, and Haslett Warehouse Company, a corporation, the property and equipment used in public utility operations at Stockton, in accordance with the terms of the proposed lease set forth in Exhibit "F" of the application; and that upon the leasing of the aforesaid warehouse property and equipment Stockton Warehouse

Company be and it is hereby authorized to discontinue public utility warehouse operations at Stockton.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that immediately upon the leasing of the property involved herein, Stockton Warehouse Company, Wilbur-Ellis Company and Haslett Warehouse Company shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or reissue tariffs on file with the Commission naming rates, rules and regulations covering warehouse operations by Stockton Warehouse Company at Stockton to show that Stockton Warehouse Company has withdrawn from or cancelled and Wilbur-Ellis Company and Haslett Warehouse Company have concurrently adopted or established as their own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall, in other respects, comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
