O P I N I O N

By the above-entitled application Yosemite Park and Curry Co. requests authority to suspend a portion of its present operations between Yosemite National Park and Lake Tahoe. The operative right in question was granted by Decision No. 31396, in Application No. 21861, and was referred to therein as Route C.

It was alleged in the application that this route is not used extensively and as a result very few passengers will be inconvenienced by its discontinuance. Applicant states that because of the national emergency caused by the war it desires to conserve tires, fuel and equipment and that for this reason it seeks to suspend operation of the service referred to. It is averred in the application that such suspension has been approved by the Department of the Interior of the United States under whose jurisdiction applicant's operations are conducted.

This does not appear to be a matter necessitating public hearing. After full consideration of the application and the evidence pertaining thereto, the Commission is of the opinion and finds public convenience and necessity require that this application be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that Yosemite Park and Curry Co. is authorized to suspend the operation of Route C between Yosemite National Park and

Lake Tahoe and intermediate points, which operative right was granted by Decision No. 31396, until January 1, 1943.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Yosemite Park and Curry Co. comply with General Order No. 79 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing amendments to its present tariffs and time schedules correctly reflecting the authority herein granted within sixty (60) days from the date hereof and upon not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
