## OPINION AND ORDER

The above-entitled matter was instituted by the Commission to ascertain the facts respecting the operations, rates and practices of toll bridge corporations subject to its jurisdiction.

Public hearing was held in San Francisco. The respondents named in the order instituting investigation appeared and submitted evidence, as did several members of the Commission's staff. At the time of the hearing American Toll Bridge Company owned and operated the Antioch and Carquinez Bridges. These were subsequently acquired by the State of California.

Evidence showed that the two other respondents, San Francisco Toll Bridge Company and Dumbarton Bridge Company, did not have proper tariffs on file. However, they recently filed tariffs. The purpose of the investigation has been satisfied.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 4244 is dismissed.
