BY THE COMMISSION:

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

In Decision No. 33663, in the above entitled application, authority was granted for the construction of a grade separation of State Highway with the tracks of Southern Pacific Company in the City of Burbank, and in that order provision was made for closing the existing San Fernando Road crossing at grade, crossing No. B-470.8.

It now appears desirable to retain this crossing for emergency use in connection with the operation of the Lockheed Aircraft Corporation, whose plant is located in the vicinity.

Therefore, good cause appearing, it is hereby ordered that Decision No. 33663 is modified to provide that upon completion of the grade separation therein authorized, and upon its being open to public use and travel, the City of Burbank shall effectively barricade and close to public use and travel, excepting for emergency use, the grade crossing identified as crossing No. B-470.8, located approximately 1600 feet southeast of the grade separation authorized.

Within six (6) months subsequent to the conclusion of the existing war, the City of Burbank shall file with this Commission certified copy of ordinance or resolution duly and regularly passed by the City Council of the City of Burbank instituting all necessary steps to legally abandon and effectively close said crossing, and Southern Pacific Company shall thereupon physically abandon said grade crossing.

In all other respects the Commission's prior orders in this proceeding are in full force and effect.

This order shall be effective immediately.
