## OPINION

Long Beach Motor Bus Company by the above-entitled application seeks authority to extend its existing common carrier passenger stage service operating between Long Beach and the California Shipbuilding Corporation on Terminal Island so that it will include service to the Administration Building of such corporation. Applicant now operates between the intersection of Ocean Boulevard and Pine Street in Long Beach and Gate No. 1 of the California Shipbuilding Corporation on Dock Street, Terminal Island. The proposed extension is about eight-tenths of one mile southwesterly along Dock Street.

No change in fares, rules or regulations is contemplated.

The same schedules will be maintained and no extra equipment will be needed.

A great many passengers of applicant are employed at, or in the vicinity of, the Administration Building. The proposed service is needed to give them adequate transportation.

No common carrier will be adversely affected by such extension.

This is not a matter necessitating a public hearing. After full consideration of this matter the Commission is of the opinion and finds that public convenience and necessity require that this application be granted. ORDER IT IS ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Long Beach Motor Bus Company authorizing ite to operate as a passenger stage corporation as that term is ... defined by section 22 of the Public Utilities Act, between Gate No. 1 of the California Shipbuilding Corporation on Dock Street, Terminal Island, and the Administration Building of the California Shipbuilding Corporation located on Dock Street, Terminal Island, as an extension and enlargement of and to be consolidated with applicant's existing rights granted by Decision No. 35445, in Application No. 24990. Long Beach Motor Bus Company its successors or assigns shall never claim before this Commission, or any court or other public body, a value for the authority hereby granted in excess of the actual cost thereof. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in the operation of said passenger stage service, Long Beach Motor Bus Company shall comply with and observe the following service regulations: File a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within a period of not to exceed thirty (30) days from the date hereof. Comply with the rules of the Commission's General Order No. 79 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-1 by filing, in triplicate, and concurrently making effective, tariffs and time schedules satisfactory to the Commission within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof. -2-
