## OPINION

Southern California Gas Company seeks authority to exercice a franchise granted by the City of Shafter permitting the maintenance of gas facilities upon the streets of said City.

ance with the Franchise Act of 1937, it is provided therein that it shall be of indeterminate duration. A fee is payable annually to the City equivalent to 2 per cent of the gross receipts arising from the use of the franchise. but not less than 1 per cent of all sales of gas by applicant within the City. The direct costs to applicant in obtaining the franchise are stated to have been \$118.50.

As this utility has for many years served gas within and about the City of Shafter without competition, it is evident that its request for a certificate to exercise its franchise should be granted.

## ORDER

A public hearing having been held upon the application of Southern California Cas Company, the matter considered, and it appearing to the Commission and it being found as a fact that public convenience and necessity so require, therefore,

and hereby is granted a certificate to exercise the rights and privileges granted by the City of Shafter by Ordinance No. 40, adopted March 9, 1942, subject to the condition, however, that no claim of value for such franchise or the authority herein granted in excess of the actual cost thereof shall ever be made by grantee, its successors, or assigns, before this Commission or before any court or other public body.

The effective date of this Order shall be the twentieth day from and after date hereof.
