



first rendered, and thereafter continues to take electric service in substantially the same amount as originally used and, at that time, the service in the opinion of Edison is no longer of a temporary character, the \$6,000 payment will be refunded without interest to the customer.

Electric energy will be delivered at 66,000 volts over a line of sufficient capacity to supply a maximum demand of 30,000 kva, 3-phase, 50-cycle, to the step-down substation owned by Kaiser Company Inc. Electric energy will be metered at 6,600 volts on the secondary side of customer's substation transformers by means of meters and instruments to be supplied, installed, owned and maintained by the utility on the customer's panel board. The customer agrees not to use the utility service as stand-by to any of its prime movers; however, the customer may install generating equipment for the purpose of stand-by to the utility's electric supply if deemed desirable.

The term of the proposed agreement is for an indefinite period, subject to termination upon 60 days written notice by the customer.

The proposed agreement also contains a statement that it shall not take effect until authorized by the Railroad Commission of the State of California, and shall at all times be subject to such changes or modifications by the Railroad Commission as said Commission may from time to time direct in the exercise of its jurisdiction.

The Commission having considered the request of applicant, and it being of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a hearing is necessary, and that this application should be granted, and good cause appearing, therefore

IT IS ORDERED that Southern California Edison Company Ltd. is hereby authorized to execute an agreement in terms substantially as set forth in "Exhibit A" attached to the application covering the installation of serving facilities and sale of electric energy at the amounts and rates and under the conditions therein provided.

Authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
