BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant is engaged at Sacramento in the business of cleaning beans and grain, and the warehousing of agricultural products. He seeks authority to discontinue his public utility warehouse operations. He represents that it is practically impossible to procure sufficient capable labor; that under existing conditions the operations are not profitable; that the storers now utilizing his warehouse facilities have no objection to the proposed discontinuance of service; and that he will bear the expense of transfering the property now in storage to other locations so that present storers will suffer no detriment, financial or otherwise, by reason of the proposal.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that William Dold, doing business as Sixteenth Street Public Bean and Grain Clouner and Warehouse, be and he is hereby authorized to discontinue public utility warehouse operations at Sacramento, subject to the following conditions:

- That he cancel his tariff on file with the Commission on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public;
- 2. That the expense of transferring to other locations the property now in storage be borne by him; and

3. That the aforesaid authority be exercised within sixty (60) days after the date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
