SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 35413 in the above-entitled application the Commission granted a certificate de novo to Frank Atkinson between Los Angeles and Compton and intermediate points over various routes. Among the routes was one along Imperial Highway and Central Avenue between the intersection of Imperial Highway and San Pedro Street and the intersection of Central Avenue and Compton Boulevard. Operation over this route was to serve the needs of the occupants of the houses being erected and the two building projects adjacent to that route which were under construction at the time the order was issued in said Decision No. 35413.

On September 8, 1942 the Commission was informed by the applicant that the building program referred to has been delayed and requests an extension of time until March 26, 1943 to establish service over that route. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the time within which service should be established along Imperial Highway and Central Avenue between the intersection of Imperial Highway and San Pedro Street and the intersection of Compton Boulevard and Central Avenue is hereby extended to and including March 26, 1943.

IT IS FURTHER URDERED that Decision No. 35413 shall in all other respects remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
