ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a spur track at grade across State Highway Route & near Brentwood, Contra Costa County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. B-62.6-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to provide one additional traffic lane on each side of the existing pavement, with tops of rails flush with roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding one per cent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1-A crossing signs (G.O.No. 75-B).

The authority herein granted is limited in time to the duration of the present war and for six months thereafter. Upon expiration of this authority applicant shall remove said track from the highway or make application for its continued maintenance on terms and conditions which the Commission may then prescribe.

Applicant shall, before constructing said crossing, submit a certified copy of a franchise or permit from the Department of Public Works of the State of California, for the construction of said crossing at grade.

No train, engine, motor, or car shall be operated over said crossing unless said train, engine, motor, or car shall be first brought to a stop and traffic on the highway protected by a member of

the train crew or other competent employee acting as flagman.

within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
