ORIGINAL

San Joaquin County is authorized to reconstruct and widen West Flora Street at grade across the North Channel spur of The Western Pacific Railroad Company near Stockton at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 4-100.3-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Western Pacific Railroad Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than the width of the adjacent portions of said street and grades of approach not greater than two per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G.O. No. 72. Protection shall be by one Standard No. 1 crossing sign (G.O. No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorizatay be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
