O P I N I O N

Luther E. Gibson, Harry V. Soanes, and Frank O. Bell, doing business as the Vallejo Bus Company, in this proceeding, ask for authority to suspend service on their Mare Island Route as authorized by Decision No. 34355, Application No. 20437, for the period during which the passenger bus service is performed between Vallejo and Mare Island by the Naval authorities at Mare Island Navy Yard. Applicants allege that the temporary abandonment of said route of operation is consistent with the directives of the Office of Defense Transportation of the United States Government in that it will promote the conservation of automobile tires, gasoline, and other critical materials; and that the public to be accommodated at Vallejo and its outlying districts would not be inconvenienced thereby. It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary; and accordingly the request will be granted.

O R D E R

Application having been made as above entitled, and the Commission being now fully advised:

IT IS ORDERED:

I. That Luther E. Gibson, Harry V. Soanes, and Frank O. Bell, doing business as the Vallejo Bus Company, be and they are hereby authorized during the period that passenger bus service may be

operated by the naval authorities at Mare Island Navy Yard between Vallejo and Mare Island, and until further order of the Commission, to suspend the portion of service as a passenger stage corporation (as defined by Section 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ of the Public Utilities Act), between Vallejo and Mare Island, described as the Mare Island Route in the service regulations appearing in the Order contained in said Decision No. 34355.

II. That applicant shall give not less than one (1) day's notice to the public and the Commission of the suspension of said service.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
