

Decision No. 36830

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of STOCKTON CITY LINES, INC., for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate motor bus service during the present emergency, primarily for the transportation of defense workers, between the following points in San Joaquin County:

1. California & Main Streets, Stockton, and U. S. Army Air Training Field on Sharps Lane, 5 1/2 miles south of Stockton.
2. California & Main Streets, Stockton, and the Army Classification Yard and Permanente Plant in Lathrop.
3. Hunter & Main Streets, Stockton, and Pollock Ship Building Corp. at Pacific & Mt. Diablo Avenues.
4. Hunter & Main Streets, Stockton, and Flotill Cannery at Fresno and South Avenues.
5. Extend E. Main Street route to Garden Street and perform tripper service between Garden Street and Sinclair and Hoover Streets.

Over routes described in the application.

BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Stockton City Lines, Inc., applicant herein, has requested that it be allowed to temporarily discontinue service as follows:

1. On that portion of its No. 2 Route (U.S. Army Air Training Field and Permanente Magnesium Plant Route) as described in Section II, 1. (a) of Decision No. 35561, between U.S. Army Classification Yard at Lathrop, a distance of about one-half mile, and Permanente Magnesium Plant.
2. On its No. 4 Route (Flotill Cannery and Morning Milk Plant Route) as described in Section II, 1. (c) of said Decision No. 35561.

Applicant alleges that very few persons patronize the service to the Permanente Magnesium Plant; that the Flotill Cannery has concluded operations for the season and will not reopen again until next year; and that these routes were established solely for the purpose of serving said industries.

It appears that the request is reasonable and should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Stockton City Lines, Inc., be and it is hereby authorized:

1. To suspend service on that portion of its U. S. Army Air Base Training Field and Permanente Magnesium Plant Route between United States Army Classification Yard at Lathrop and Permanente Magnesium Plant, as described in Section II, 1. (a) of Decision No. 35561 until further order of the Commission; and

2. To suspend service on its Flotill Cannery and Morning Milk Plant Route, as described in Section II, 1. (c) of said Decision No. 35561 until further order of the Commission; subject to the condition, however, that it will reinstate service on these routes if and when public convenience and necessity require.

In all other respects Decision No. 35561 shall remain in full force and effect.
