ORDER

Pacific Electric Railway Company is authorized to construct a spur track at grade across Talbert Avenue, Huntzinger Street, Gisler Street and Fairview Avenue, and two spur tracks across Spruce Avenue, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as follows:

Talbert Avenue	Crossing No. 6N-39.18-C
Huntzinger Street	Crossing No. 6N-39.64-C
Fairview Avenue	Crossing No. 6N-40.78-C

Gisler Street and Spruce Avenue are not now actually constructed and open to travel at the points of crossing and this Order is not an authorization for the construction of opening of said Gisler Street and Spruce Avenue to public use across said track. Said track shall be so constructed that grades of approach not exceeding six per cent will be feasible, in the event that the construction of openings of Gisler Street and Spruce Avenue across said track shall hereafter be authorized and so that said grade crossings may be made safe for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traffic.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction at each location shall be equal or superior

to Standard No. 2 of G.O. No. 72, without superelevation and of widths to conform to the portions of the streets now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadways and with grades of approach not exceeding six per cent.

Protection at Crossing No. 6N-39.18-C (Talbert Avenue) shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (G.O.No. 75-B). Protection at Crossing No. 6N-39.64-C (Euntzinger Street) and Crossing No. 6N-40.78-C (Fairview Avenue), shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G.O. No. 75-B).

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this Order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This Order shall be effective immediately.
