FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Under authority granted in Decision No. 18122 the Department of Public Works in 1927 constructed a highway crossing under the tracks of Southern Pacific Company at Mossdale, San Joaquín County. This decision provided that clearances conform with the provisions of our General Order No. 26-A and the subway was so constructed. It now appears that because of certain repair work it is necessary to reduce the overhead clearance 4" to 13'8" above the surface of the highway. Applicant has requested a modification of the Commission's order. The request is reasonable and should be granted, therefore

Good Cause Appearing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Condition No. 2 of Decision No. 18122, dated March 30, 1927, is hereby modified to read as follows:

"Said undergrade crossing shall be constructed with clearances conforming in general to the provisions of the Commission's General Order No. 26-A, excepting that the overhead clearance may be reduced to a minimum of not less than 13 feet 8 inches."

In all other respects Decision No. 18122 is in full force and effect.
