FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

The transportation service involved in this proceeding is performed by applicant for Schenley Distilleries, Inc. It consists of the drayage of alcoholic liquors in barrels, in shipments weighing 3 tons or more, from, to and between certain warehouses situated in the City and County of San Francisco. A minimum rate of \$1.70 per ton has been established for this transportation in re Rates for San Francisco City Carriers, 39 C.R.C. 636, as amended. However, Decision No. 35911 of February 10, 1942, in this proceeding, authorized applicant to observe rates not lower than \$1.16 per ton for aggregate quantities of not less than 500 tons per calendar month. This authorization will expire March 2, 1943. By supplemental application, its extension for a one-year period is sought.

Applicant represents that the conditions surrounding the transportation involved have not undergone any material change since the authorization in question was issued. It claims that, under the circumstances, extension of its authorization is warranted.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the proposed extension of applicant's authorization is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the authority granted San Francisco Warehouse Company by Decision No. 35011 of February 10, 1942, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to March 1, 1944, unless sooner changed, canceled or further extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective March 1, 1943.
