OPINION AND ORDER

own motion for the purpose of determining whether or not respondents, while holding radial highway common or highway contract carrier permits, have been or are subject to or in violation of the long-and-short-haul provisions of Article XII, Section 21 of the State Constitution, and, if so, whether or not any undercharges resulted therefrom which they or their respective trustees in bankruptcy should be directed to collect.

Prior to hearing, counsel for the Commission's transportation department filed a written motion to discontinue the investigation, supported by a memorandum of points and authorities. Public hearing was scheduled for the purpose of receiving argument on the

motion, but at the hearing an agreement was reached that in lieu of oral argument the case might be submitted on written memoranda. Subsequently, respondents informed the Commission that they did not desire to file a memorandum, and that as far as they were concerned the investigation might be discontinued. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the investigation instituted in Case No. 4545 be and it is hereby discontinued.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
