ORDER OF REVOCATION

On June 7, 1937, the Commission issued its Decision No. 29836 authorizing Glenn S. Martin to acquire a seasonal passenger stage operative right between Palm Springs and Cathedral City and between Blue Jay and Cedar Glen, as created by Decision No. 29389, dated December 21, 1936. By Decision No. 35015, rendered February 10, 1942, Martin was authorized to suspend this service until February 10, 1943.

In a letter dated May 9, 1943, Martin informs the Commission that he is unable to resume this operation and requests the revocation of the operative right therefor. Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the operative right heretofore created by the Commission's Decision No. 29389, rendered December 21, 1936, in Application No. 20315, as acquired by applicant

Martin under the authority of the Commission's Decision No. 29836, dated June 7, 1937, as amended by Decision No. 33451, rendered September 3, 1940, is hereby revoked and annulled.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all tariffs and time tables now on file with the Commission and in effect in the name of Glenn S. Martin are hereby cancelled.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
