OPINION

Albert E. Warburton, in an amended application, requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to establish and operate an automotive service for the transportation of passengers between Martinez and Permanente Metals Corporation Shipyards Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4, and intermediate points. The shipyards are located in Richmond, California.

It is alleged in the application that large numbers of defense workers are employed at the four yards mentioned, and that with many of them transportation to and from work is a serious problem. The housing facilities in Richmond are naturally limited and employees must look elsewhere for living quarters.

The shippards operate on a 24-hour basis and work three shifts.

Time schedules for the proposed service are arranged in conformity with the movement of the shifts.

Only shipyard employees will be handled. No stops will be made in the city of Richmond except at the shipyards. Stops in

Martinez, Pinole and other points will be made only to pick up or discharge employees.

One way fare from or to Martinez, to or from any of the shippards, is fixed at 25 cents, round-trip 50 cents. It appears that applicant has sufficient equipment to carry on the proposed service.

The certificated carriers who are rendering passenger service in this area do not oppose the granting of the application.

The service as proposed seems to be a necessary one and the application will be granted. A public hearing is not required.

Albert E. Warburton is placed upon notice that "operative rights" as such do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, they extend to the holder a full or partial monopoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State which is not in any respect limited to the number of rights which may be given.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to Albert E. Warburton authorizing the establishment and operation of a passenger stage service, as that term is defined in Section 21 of the Public Utilities Act, for the

Routes to all Shipyards are the same to this point, and routes to the various Shipyards are as follows:

- To Shinyard No. 1 Leave San Pablo Avenue at 13th Street; via 13th Street to 10th Street, Richmond; via 10th Street to Cutting Boulevard; via Cutting Boulevard to 4th Street and Shipyard No. 1.
- To Shipyards Nos. 3 and 4 San Pablo to 13th Street; via 13th Street to Pennsylvania, Richmond; via Pennsylvania to 6th Street; via 6th Street to Barrett Avenue; via Barrett Avenue to Garrard Boulevard; via Garrard Boulevard to Cutting Boulevard to yards Nos. 3 and 4.
- To Shipvard No. 2 23rd Street gate; San Pablo Avenue to 23rd Street; via 23rd Street to its end and the 23rd Street gate of Shipyard No. 2.

To 14th Street gate of Shipyard No. 2, San Pablo Avenue to 23rd Street, via 23rd Street to Cutting Boulevard; via Cutting Boulevard to 14th Street and the 14th Street gate at Shipyard No. 2.

4. Applicant may turn its motor vehicles at termini or intermediate points either in the intersection of the street or by operating around a block, contiguous to such intersection, in either direction.
