OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, C. F. Quiggle, an individual doing business as Valley Warehouse Co., seeks authority to discontinue public utility warehouse service at "Valley Warehouse No. 5" located in Sutter County, in the vicinity of Oswald.

Applicant represents that the warehouse has been vacant during the year last past and is now vacant and that its further operation is no longer required. In this regard applicant states that other warehouse facilities which he operates in the same vicinity are more than adequate to meet the demand for warehouse space and that warehouse facilities of other utility warehousemen are also available.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the authority sought is justified. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that C. F. Quiggle, an individual doing business as Valley Warehouse Co., be and he is hereby authorized to discontinue public utility warehouse service at "Valley Warehouse No. 5."

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that immediately upon the discontinuance of the aforesaid public utility warehouse operations C. F. Quiggle shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or reissue the tariffs on file with the Commission naming rates, rules and regulations covering warehouse operations at "Valley Warehouse No. 5"; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall, in other respects, comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
