OPINION AND ORDER

In this application California Water & Telephone Company, hereinafter termed the California Company, and Southern California Telephone Company, hereinafter termed the Southern Company, join for the purpose of securing authority to relocate a portion of the common boundary of the Moreno and Riverside exchange areas.

The California Company operates the Moreno exchange in Riverside County and other telephone properties in California. The Southern Company operates the Riverside exchange and other properties in the southern part of California.

Applicants desire to move the aforesaid common exchange boundary westward thus adding a small portion of the Riverside exchange area of the Southern Company to the Moreno exchange area of the California Company. The Camp Haan United States military reservation in Riverside County has been enlarged and now includes certain territory within the Riverside exchange area. The United States Army desires that the additional territory shall be included in the Moreno exchange area with the remainder of the reservation. The present and proposed boundaries are shown on a map entitled Exhibit "A" attached to the application. Although there is no present telephone service in

OPINION AND ORDER

In this application California Water & Telephone Company, hereinafter termed the California Company, and Southern California Telephone Company, hereinafter termed the Southern Company, join for the purpose of securing authority to relocate a portion of the common boundary of the Moreno and Riverside exchange areas.

The California Company operates the Moreno exchange in Riverside County and other telephone properties in California. The Southern Company operates the Riverside exchange and other properties in the southern part of California.

Applicants desire to move the aforesaid common exchange boundary westward thus adding a small portion of the Riverside exchange area of the Southern Company to the Moreno exchange area of the California Company. The Camp Haan United States military reservation in Riverside County has been enlarged and now includes certain territory within the Riverside exchange area. The United States Army desires that the additional territory shall be included in the Moreno exchange area with the remainder of the reservation. The present and proposed boundaries are shown on a map entitled Exhibit "A" attached to the application. Although there is no present telephone service in

the addition to the reservation, the relocation of the common exchange boundary as proposed will result in increased charges for certain telephone services furnished the United States Army at Camp Haan and March Field. Two foreign exchange private branch exchange trunks from the Riverside exchange are connected to the Camp Haan private branch exchange. The charges for these trunks are made up of the base rate, message charges, suburban mileage charges, and foreign exchange mileage charges, the latter being at a substantially higher rate of charge than the suburban mileage. After the boundary change the lower priced suburban mileage in the Riverside exchange area will be decreased and the higher priced foreign exchange mileage in the Moreno exchange will be increased with the net result of a forty-two dollar (\$42) increase per month in charges to the Army for the two trunks. Likewise, the suburban mileage of three Riverside foreign exchange private branch exchange trunks to March Field will be decreased and the foreign exchange mileage will be increased, resulting in a net increase of thirteen dollars and fifty cents (\$13.50) per month in the charges for the three trunks. Attached to the application as Exhibits "B" and "C" are copies of letters from the Signal Corps of the Army agreeing to the increased charges quoted above coincident with the boundary change.

The Commission has given consideration to the Applicants' request and is of the opinion that this is not a matter requiring a hearing and that the application should be granted as herein provided, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that on or before November 1, 1943 California Water & Telephone Company shall include in its Moreno exchange area that certain territory shown enclosed by a "proposed boundary" as set forth on a map marked Exhibit "A" attached to the application, provided the necessary tariff sheets and revised map are filed with the Railroad Commission not later than fifteen (15) days before the effective date thereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Southern California Telephone Company may exclude from its Riverside exchange area that certain territory shown enclosed by a "proposed boundary" as set forth on a map marked Exhibit "A" attached to the application, effective as of the date of the above ordered change in the

Moreno exchange area provided the necessary tariff sheets and map are filed with the Railroad Commission not later than ten (10) days before the effective date thereof.

For all other purposes the effective date of this Order shall be the twentieth day from and after the date hereof.
