FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

By Decision No. 37520, dated September 1, 1942, the Commission authorized Pacific Greyhound Lines to suspend its passenger stage service between Half Moon Bay and San Gregorio and between Pescadero and Davenport for a period of approximately one year.

By its first supplemental application, applicant requests authority to continue the suspension of that service for a period ending six months after the termination of the present war shall have been officially declared. As justification for the proposed continued suspension applicant asserts, in effect, that the need for public transportation today is substantially the same as that which existed when the original application was filed. Applicant presently asserts that war conditions have imposed heavy obligations on it to devote its entire stock of passenger stage equipment and force of employees to the most beneficial use conducive to the war effort.

In our judgment the applicant should be authorized to continue suspension of this service for a further period of one year. This is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary.

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The above-entitled matter having been fully considered and the Commission being fully advised therein,

IT IS ORDERED that Pacific Greyhound Lines is hereby authorized to suspend until September 1, 1944, all passenger stage service between Half Moon Bay and San Gregorio and between Pescadero and Davenport, subject to the following conditions:

1. That applicant shall immediately supplement its tariffs and time tables to reflect the foregoing authority.
2. That the suspended service may be resumed upon not less than ten (10) days' notice to the Commission prior to the expiration of the period of suspension herein specified or of such extension thereof as may hereafter be granted by further order, and upon compliance with the provisions of General Orders Nos. 79 and 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
