In the matter of the application of COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES for permission to construct a grade crossing over the tracks and right of way of the Southern Pacific Railroad on 92nd Street) Application No. 25785

BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

The County of Los Angeles is authorized to construct 92nd Street across the San Pedro Branch of Southern Pacific Company, in the County of Los Angeles, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BG-489.8. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 56 feet and grades of approach not greater than six per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G. O. No. 75-B). Upon completion, Crossing No. BG-489.9, about 400 feet south, shall be abandoned and closed.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void, if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
